- At Housing New Zealand the most senior marketing decision maker might be called the 'Business Research Manager'

This added value is incorporated into IncNet.
Extensive research is devoted to ensure IncNet includes all relevant operating divisions and subsidiaries of both Australia and New Zealand's largest organisations.

In large companies functional decision making can be broad-based and IncNet strives to capture this divisionalised responsibility and decision making.

## Accuracy

Whilst no database can be 100\% correct at any given time (due to the reality of constant change), our methodology centres on trying to keep IncNet as accurate as our resources allow.

All contacts on our file are updated on a continual basis via telephone research.
