For example:

- The most senior marketing decision maker at Apple Australia might be called the 'National Commercial Manager'
- At Housing New Zealand the most senior marketing decision maker might be called the 'Business Research Manager'

This added value is incorporated into IncNet.

Extensive research is devoted to ensure **IncNet** includes all relevant operating divisions and subsidiaries of both Australia and New Zealand's largest organisations.

In large companies functional decision making can be broad-based and IncNet strives to capture this divisionalised responsibility and decision making.

Federal

All Federal Government departments including State Offices. Also includes major divisions.

State

All State Government departments and utilities. All major Hospitals and Area Health services. Also includes major Regional Offices.

Local

All Local Government.

c) Public Companies

All industrial companies listed on the Australian Stock Exchange.

An organisation that controls a significant advertising budget, but does not meet the above criteria, will be included eg Office of the Government Advertising.

An organisation that is owned by another organisation which meets the above criteria, but does not itself meet the above criteria, may also be included.

IncNet NZ covers over 7,500 leading New Zealand organisations based on the following criteria:

The general criteria for inclusion is NZD\$10 million+ revenue or budget and / or 30+ employees.
